HISTORIC HIGHS & LOWS



From River Drying to Severe Storms

This year's irrigation season brought a mix of extremes, from historic low river levels that dried parts of the Albuquerque reach to lateseason storms that replenished water supplies but also damaged farms and MRGCD infrastructure. IRRIGATION & HYDROLOGY

The MRGCD water operations and communications team publishes a <u>monthly Irrigation and Hydrology</u> <u>Update</u> following each board meeting. These updates provide the latest information on water storage, the Rio Grande Compact, water supply conditions, and other key hydrology topics.

WATER STORAGE

While El Vado Dam continues to be assessed by the Bureau of Reclamation under their Safety of Dams Program, ABQ Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority and the MRGCD reached an agreement to allow storage of Native Rio Grande water in the Water Authority's allotted space in Abiquiu Reservoir for up to 10 years. Native Rio Grande water storage was NOT available in 2025 due to Rio Grande Compact debt status.

WATER LEASING PROGRAM

MRGCD plans to offer the Water Leasing Program to irrigators in 2026, however, funding has not yet been awarded for the program. MRGCD hopes to open enrollment for the 2026 Water Leasing Program in early January. If you would like to be notified once enrollment opens, please fill out an Interest Form here. 
